Logitech announces a pair of flagship wireless mice-- the MX Master 2S and MX Anywhere 2S, both featuring support for the new Flow software, allowing users to control up to 3 PCs using one mouse.



"One computer used to be enough, but we've moved into an era where roughly one in 10 people are working across multiple computers at the same time," the company claims. "Using multiple computers can help you avoid distractions and speed up processor-intensive operations, but working across multiple computers can be a hassle... With Flow and a new MX mouse, you can enhance your productivity-- for instance, copying and pasting files from one computer to another-- helping you become more precise and focused in the multi-computer world."

As well as software, the two mice promise hardware upgrades, with a more precise sensor (4000DPI, up from 1600DPI in previous models) and battery life reaching up to 70 days on a single charge. The mice differ solely in design, since the Master 2S has a large ergonomic grip and speed-adaptive scrolling, while the MX Anywhere 2S is a stripped-down device ideal for portable use.

The MX Master 2S and MX Anywhere 2S are available from June 2017. Customers can get the Flow software now from the Logitech website.
