Lenovo announces the Flex 11-- a ChromeOS-powered 2-in-1 convertible laptop with an 11.6-inch 1366 x 768 resolution touchscreen and a 2.1GHz quad-core ARM processor "designed with Android apps in mind."



Allowing for the transformation between notebook and tablet modes is a 360-degree hinge, and one can also use the Flex 11 in 2 other modes, "watch" and "tent." Construction promises to be drop-resistant up to 75cm, while the keyboard can handle spills of up to 330ml, with channels draining liquid away from electrical components.

Further tech specs include 4GB RAM, 32GB storage and a battery powering up to 10 hours of use on a single charge. Connectivity comes through USB-C, regular USB, HDMI and an SD card.

The Flex 11 ships by end April 2017.
